






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Our 96 staff members serve a diverse population of students sixth grade through eighth grade participating in:



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School Improvement Plan Goals

Worthy Target #1: Curriculum - All students will set and monitor their academic goals using formative assessments and implement four pillars for success in the 21st Century; Citizenship, Technology, Academic Perseverance and Career Literacy.

Worthy Target #2: Instruction - All teachers will implement effective classroom strategies; Thinking Maps, as monitored by walk through data.

Worthy Target #3: Assessment - All grade level and content teams will implement the Data Team Cycle and conduct 4 data cycles, once each quarter.





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School Improvement Plan Accountability

Teachers

Curriculum: All teachers will lead students in creating goals based on their formative assessments and implement the four pillars of success in the 21st Century.

Instruction: All teachers will increase critical thinking skills through the use of instructional strategies; Thinking Maps.

Assessment: All teachers will incorporate three Data Team Cycles at a minimum.

Students

Curriculum: 100% of students will monitor their academic growth goals and success with the four pillars as measured by their goal tracking document.


Instruction: 100% of students will show growth in critical thinking skills through the use of Thinking Maps as monitored by McRel.

Assessment: 100% of students will show academic growth with priority standards as measured by the Data Team Cycle.

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BOY Benchmark

Students in Waukegan Public Schools participate in benchmark assessments in Reading and Math three times during the school year to measure student achievement. We are able to disaggregate student achievement into performance levels that help teachers know which students are ready to accelerate their learning and which students need extra assistance. In addition, benchmark assessment results also highlight which concepts or skills students have mastered or are ready to learn and provide details to teachers for lesson planning. You may receive a copy of such a report during conferences or at another time during the year.

At Miguel Juarez, all students in grades 6-8 participated in the BOY NWEA MAP Reading and Math assessments in September. Individual student results will be presented at your child's upcoming conference. Our goal is to see 80% of our students meet their growth target and at least 80% of our students ending the year at or above grade level expectations.





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
BOY Benchmark Math Attainment Percent of Students At or Above Grade Level



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BOY Math Attainment Overall









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BOY Math Attainment Grade 6










BOY Math Attainment Grade 7

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BOY Benchmark Reading Attainment Percent of Students At or Above Grade Level










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
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BOY Reading Attainment Grade 6




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BOY Reading Attainment Grade 7

Our goal for the 2016-2017 School Year is to have 60% of students in grades 6-8 to meet or exceed standards. We will connect Reading and Writing, increase instruction in Vocabulary Development, continue to implement CCSS, and increase interventions for Bilingual and Special Education students.





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2016 PARCC Math Attainment


Percent of Students

Meeting or Exceeding Grade Level Expectations



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
PARCC Math Attainment Overall
